



Accident and Emergency Guidance

For the following, go immediately to the nearest Emergency Department or call **999**.

- Chest pain
- Sudden collapse
- Suspected spinal injuries
- Complex fractures
- Dislocations

When dealing with an accident or incident:

- If the injury is minor, take appropriate action.
- If the injury requires specialist treatment, call the emergency services.
- Do not move someone with major injuries - wait for the emergency services.
- Contact the injured person's parent/next of kin.

Don't forget to record any accident/incident in an accident/incident report form, which can be found next to the first aid boxes. This should be completed in full and then passed on to a member of the committee, to ensure it is officially recorded and any necessary action is taken.
